Before you start on your journey, you may find it useful to have a final destination in mind. Take a look at the list of healthcare and science related careers and select any that may be of interest.

Advocacy Worker

An advocacy worker supports and represents people to make sure that their rights and interests are respected. They provide guidance and assistance.

Biochemist

A biochemist studies chemical processes and substances within living organisms to understand biological functions. They conduct experiments and analyse results.

Biomedical Scientist

A biomedical scientist analyses biological samples to diagnose and research diseases. They play an important role in patient care.

Care Home Manager

A care home manager oversees the operations and staff of a care home. They make sure that there are high standards of care and compliance with regulations.

Care Worker

A care worker provides personal and practical support to individuals with various needs. They help with daily activities and maintaining independence.

Clinical Scientist

A clinical scientist uses scientific knowledge to develop and improve clinical procedures and treatments. They usually work in hospital laboratories.

Clinical Psychologist

A clinical psychologist diagnoses and treats mental health issues through methods, such as therapy and counselling. They assess needs and develop treatment plans.

Chemist

A chemist conducts experiments and analyses substances to understand their properties and interactions. They work with chemicals to develop products and processes.





GP

A GP provides medical care and diagnoses and treats a wide range of health issues for patients of all ages.

Healthcare Science Assistant

A healthcare science assistant assists with laboratory work and patient care. They prepare samples, maintain equipment, and record data.

Learning Disability Nurse

A learning disability nurse provides specialised nursing care to individuals with learning disabilities. They work in various settings, including hospitals and schools.

Medical Physicist

A medical physicist applies the principles of physics to medicine, particularly in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases.

Residential Support Worker

Assists individuals living in residential settings with daily activities and support needs, promoting their wellbeing and independence.


